This 2.66% increase corresponds to the consumer price index in Québec, as at September 30, 2011. It respects the requirements under section 83.3 of the *Financial Administration Act* of the Government of Québec.

² The increase pertains to fees applicable under article 5 of the *Regulation respecting immigration consultants*. This 3.2% increase corresponds to the consumer price index in Canada, as at September 30, 2011. It respects the requirements under article 16 of the *Regulation respecting immigration consultants*.
